 - b. Name, address and VAT no. of the legal entity of the Partner
 - c. Possible contact persons
 - d. A description of the activity to be performed by the AU department NB! 2 brackets
 - e. Amount(s)
- 3. <u>Delete</u> all instructive comments.
- 4. Send the filled out draft to *AU TTO at tto@au.dk* for approval before sending the draft for signatures at the partner and Head of Department.

Intellectual property and publication:

Each party shall own the results created by that party in course of the Project. Results created jointly by the parties shall be jointly owned by those Parties according to their intellectual contribution. Both parties shall have a non-exclusive right to utilise, free of charge, any results not constituting a patentable invention or software generated and exchanged under the Project. There will not be developed patentable inventions or software during the Project. The parties shall be entitled to publish their own results including the Project Report. Jointly owned results can be published jointly by the Parties, or, solely by one Party if the other Party does not wish to participate in the publication. Publication and authorship shall follow the rules laid down in the Danish Code of Conduct for Research Integrity. Substantial contributions to the work shall always be disclosed accordingly. AU reserves the right to use any samples received by us in other technical investigations not directly connected to the Project.

Choice of law and venue:

All disputes between the parties about the interpretation and implementation of this agreement shall be settled in accordance with Danish law, excluding its conflict of law provisions. Disputes shall be decided by the ordinary courts of Denmark.
